The Timon Tigers 2017-2018 Basketball season was year one for head coach Jason Rowe. Certainly not a stranger to WNY Basketball, Rowe welcomed new faces, installed new schemes and instilled a new philosophy, all leading to an 18 - 4 record heading into the postseason.

To date, Rowe's 'share the load' philosophy has led to balanced scoring and solid team defense. Four different players have led the team in scoring on multiple occasions.

Center Master Radford, the lone senior starter averages 14.5 points, 10 rebounds and 5 blocks per game, including 16 double-doubles. The backcourt is solidified by junior starters Julian Cunningham (17.1 points per game) and Tahron Goudelock (11.7 points per game) with solid bench support from Cullen Tonge and Angel Torres.

Frontline production, led by versatile 6' 7" swingman Alero World (11 points per game), John Shields (4.2 PPG) and Jeremy Glinski, has been solid.

First year head coach Jason Rowe is Western New York's fifth all-time leading high school scorer, a State Champion at Buffalo Traditional and two-time WNY Player of the Year. He played professional basketball in Europe for 15 seasons. The Tigers are assisted by Jeremy Rowe, Joe Licata, and Chris O'Connell.

For the second time this decade, the Canisius Crusaders captured a third straight Manhattan Cup Championship last season. The Crusaders have appeared in eight of the last nine Manhattan Cup Finals with seven championships over that span. The '17 - '18 team returns eight players from last year and is working hard every day to earn the right to be crowned champions again this season.

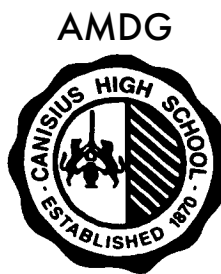
The current edition of Canisius High School Basketball features a balanced scoring attack as four players are averaging in double figures. Senior Austin James is a tremendous offensive weapon scoring 14 points per game while also dishing out 4 assists a game. James has had an excellent year from behind the arc with 40+ three pointers as of press time. While Austin often has a hot hand, you'll be hard pressed to find a better shooter in WNY than senior Nick MacDonald (13 ppg). Nick has made 60+ three pointers thus far and is shooting a blistering 48% from outside the arc. Jayce Johnson has had a stellar senior season averaging 12 ppg, 5 assists per game, while often guarding the opposing team's best player. Jayce has committed to Wagner College to play football in the fall. Versatile senior forward Ryan Bradley has been an outstanding inside/out threat for CHS as he averages 11 ppg and 10 rebounds per game. Ryan is capable of scoring in the post, handling the ball, while also having the ability to knock down three pointers. Senior forwards Brendan Trapper and Jon Evans have provided the team with a solid post presence while making many plays that don't show up on the stat sheet. Sophomore guards Dewayne Vass and Ishmael Fairclough have both shown significant improvement and continue to earn more playing time as the season progresses. Junior Joe Jamison and senior Connor McCaffrey have been cogs in the rotation to ensure the team doesn't lose a beat when they turn to the bench. Rounding out the Crusaders roster of 13 are juniors Andrew Hartnett, Jason Martin, and Joe Ingrando who compete very hard on a daily basis.

Canisius basketball has a terrific support group of faculty, parents, alumni, students, and friends which provide the blue and gold with a great advantage night in and night out. The Crusaders are making strides every game and aim to peak come playoff time in their quest for a fourth straight Manhattan Cup Championship.

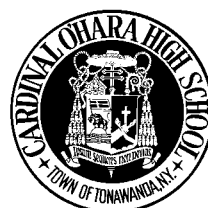

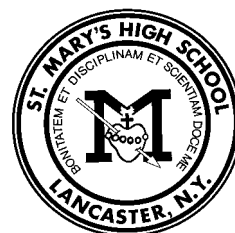
