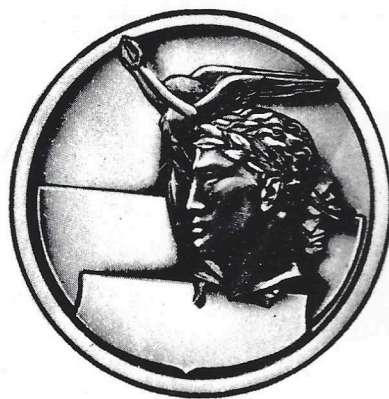

**MAYOR JAMES D. GRIFFIN**

From his roots in the old First Ward to his residency in City Hall, Mayor James D. Griffin is typical of a Buffalonian “*talking proud.*”

Mayor Griffin attended St. Brigid’s Elementary School and Our Lady of Victory High School. He is a graduate of Erie County Technical Institute.

His military career saw him enlist as a private and achieve the rank of Lieutenant. He served as a paratrooper and saw action in the Korean conflict.

He has worked shoulder to shoulder with the people he now represents in City Hall, in the feed mills and grain elevators of the Buffalo waterfront and on the Buffalo Creek Railroad as an engineer.

Mayor Griffin served two terms as the Ellicott District Councilman and served as New York State Senator from 1967 to 1977. He was elected to his first term as Mayor in 1977 and re-elected in 1981 by a 10-1 margin.

His wife is the former Margaret McMahon. They have three children, Maureen, Megan and Thomas. Mayor Griffin and his family reside on Dorrance Avenue in South Buffalo.

Mayor Griffin is an avid Buffalo sports fan. He himself has been a participant throughout the years. In his younger days he was a member of the Buffalo Municipal Baseball Association and still is actively involved in softball. A booster in bringing major league baseball to Buffalo, he is supporting our Class AA Eastern League Buffalo Bisons to the limit.
