
To date, Rowe's 'share the load' philosophy has led to balanced scoring and solid team defense. Five different players have led the team in scoring on multiple occasions.




Frontline production, led by versatile swingman Ryan Sheehan and Alex Reinhardt has been solid.



The Canisius Crusaders have won the class A regular season title and will compete in the Manhattan Cup Championship game for the 6th consecutive season and 11th time in 12 years. The 2019-2020 Crusaders are playing an up-tempo, fast brand of basketball averaging 76 points a game. This year's team is deep and versatile, working hard all season with the goal of playing their best basketball in March.


Canisius is led by senior Dewayne Vass who is averaging 17 points, 8 rebounds, 5 assists, and 3 steals per game, leading the team in each category. The "do it all" point guard plays his best in the biggest games and has earned the distinction of being one of the best players in WNY. Junior sharp shooter Joe Ciocca is connecting on 41% of his 3 point attempts and is the Crusaders second leading scorer at 12 points a game. Senior Eric Kegler has had a solid season as he has evolved into a versatile player who is effective on both ends of the floor. Kegler is an inside/out threat on the offensive end while also being one of the team's leading rebounders. Senior Ishmael Fairclough has played a tremendous role for Canisius as one of the hardest working players on the floor each game while also being one of the best defenders on the team. 6'5 junior center Max Dowling mans the middle for CHS. Dowling is scoring 11 points a game and has continued to develop his offensive game and defense while averaging 5 rebounds a game this season. Freshman Shane Cercone has had an outstanding first season for Canisius. Cercone has gotten better and better throughout the season, is a great defender capable of guarding any position and a threat to score whenever he touches the ball. Senior Kaleb Harris has provided valuable minutes at the guard position on both ends of the floor. Juniors Eric Geisler and Malik Jemison have

contributed to the team's great depth as both are reliable guards with very bright futures. Juniors Will Pieroni, David Barbara, Willie Herron, and Hunter Glaser along with late season junior varsity call up sophomore Declan Ryan round out the Crusaders roster of 14.

The Canisius High School fan base of parents, students, alumni, and friends remain the best in WNY and provide a great advantage each night for the blue and gold. The Crusaders have played an extremely challenging schedule with the goal of improving every game and peaking at the right time in their quest to bring the Manhattan Cup back to Delaware Avenue.





### ST. FRANCIS HIGH SCHOOL RED RAIDERS

The 2019-2020 St. Francis Red Raider basketball team was tasked with replacing 8 seniors that graduated off the 2018-2019 team. Most notably the Raiders graduated two time All Catholic point guard Justin Poumpey and All Catholic forward Lucas Theisen, add Dorion Ivey and the Raiders had to replace 80% of the teams scoring from the year before. The Red Raiders commitment in the off season and during the year showed a group of seniors, juniors, and sophomores that were up to putting in the work to keep the Red Raiders competitive in the MMAA, WNY, and the State.

The Red Raiders embarked on another daunting non-league schedule that included some of the top teams locally and state wide. The Raiders schedule included games against Long Island power and current #16 in the state Holy Trinity, St. Dominic's (ranked in Long Island), Albany's Green Tech (# 20 in Class AA), 2 games against current #6 Class A team in the state Health Science, Rochester's University Prep (#14 AA), as well as Bishop Grimes and Syracuse Academy of Science which are both ranked in Section 3. The Red Raiders also faced off against top local schools ranked in the WNY Top 10; McKinley, Orchard Park, and West Seneca West. Add these games to the ultracompetitive MMAA schedule and the Red Raiders boosted one of the toughest schedules in WNY. At press time the Raiders currently stood with a record of 8-13 and a 5-6 mark in the league. The Red Raiders have proven that they can play with the best teams in the state, but have not shown the ability to finish close games. The Raiders have a 4-8 record in games decided in the final minutes. Coach Ferris's Raiders have held the lead in the final minute in 5 of the 8 loses. Highlights of the season include non-league wins over MLK Tournament host Bishop Grimes (Syracuse) and hard fought victories over local rivals West Seneca East and West. In league the Red Raiders hold victories over Cardinal O'Hara, Nichols, St. Mary's of Lancaster and a season sweep of rival Bishop Timon which included an overtime buzzer beater at Timon.

Individually the Red Raiders have battled injuries and sicknesses throughout the season that took key members off their roster for multiple games. Leading the way has been senior captains David Bartholomew and Jack Bickerstaff, as well as the junior duo of Amiel Collins and Peyton Consigli. These 4 have been carrying the load on the offensive end as each have averaged double digit scoring. Consigli has made 55 three pointers with 4 games and the playoffs ahead he is closing in the school record for 3 pointers made in a season set by Mark Renkas (95-96) with 69. Filling the shoes of 2-year starting PG Poumpey has been a combination of senior Chris Dempsey and sophomore CJ Moore. Off the bench Coach Ferris has relied on sophomore big man Brendan Reid and juniors Aidan Brunner and Andre Goldsmith to provide valuable minutes as they gain experience playing at the varsity level in the MMAA. Providing depth for the Raiders has been senior Theodore Katholos, Nate Langdon and Conor Black.

The St. Francis Red Raiders basketball team with the support of the students, fans, and alumni look to get back to the finals and bring the Manhattan Cup back to halls of St. Francis High School.
